
Persuasives

I would like to live in the outback in Africa like the lion surrounded by all my close friends and family.


Although I would not like to live in the zoo I would like to have humans around to watch my family and I grow.


I would like to be a lion because they are fast and strong. They are the kings of the jungle. I would like to be the queen of the jungle.


Lion cubs are very cute and I would like to have some in my life that's why I would like to be a lion.






































Now it is your turn
