G5 are walking a Virtual Challenge of Route 66

As a school we are walking 3940km along the famous Route 66 in America. G5 are walking through Missouri 510 km. We have started walking/ running as part of the daily fitness program. In 8 fitness sessions we have completed 165.54Km. We walk on the track and count the laps completed for each session. Everyone is encouraging each other as we are all making up the class total in kms.



Learning in B2

B2 has had a great start to Term 2. In Maths, we have been learning how to calculate percentages, learning the BODMAS rules (order of operations) and working with positive and negative numbers. We are continuing our weekly spelling units and reading groups. We have been looking at ways to improve our narrative text writing by including metaphors, similes, personification and onomatopoeia in our work. In History we are learning about the path to Federation in Australia. B2 is participating in our school virtual run along Route 66 in the USA and we have been going out running several times a week. In Chinese, the students are enthusiastically working on designing their scroll containing encouraging words.





Learning in B3

I am Mr. Burke and am thrilled to be working with B3 for the next six weeks on my final preservice teaching placement! Last Wednesday, we investigated the size of our ecological footprint and began thinking of ways in which we could reduce our negative impact on the Earth.

What's happening in B4 with Miss Emily

In B4 we have been learning about our times tables and how arrays can help us learn our times tables. Arrays are the visual representation of our times tables and can help us learn them easily. Each student got given different times tables, had to use arrays to figure them out and then chose 1 or 2 Arrays to create a skyscraper with. We used black paper with fluro coloured squares to make it seem like a night skyline of a busy city. The students were then able to design how they wanted their building to look. Have a look at some pictures and the different designs that are in our 'Array City'.

We have been doing our own science experiment with the left over Mother's Day flowers. We are learning how flowers and other flora and fauna receive their nurturance. We trimmed our flowers and picked off the remaining leaves, put them in jars and coloured the water with old textas. We are monitoring their progress and we are hoping they will change colours. We hypothesised that the coloured water will get sucked up into the petals and change their colours.





Week 2 in the Science room. B4 have been studying soil and the different types of soil this week in their science topic of Rocks and Minerals. We went out in our yard and found some different examples of soil. We then had to describe the texture, colour and whether we thought our sample was porous or not.

The students absolutely love these sessions and are targeting their fine motor goals.

We are looking forward to Sports Day later in the year and have been busy practicing our gross motor skills for this. It's always fun at Paradise!
