Dear Paradise Community

Firstly, I would like to apologise for this newsletter being a little late. Unfortunately, we were down in our Admin team last week. Lee is on leave and Cherie has a netball injury. We are very happy to have Cherie back at work now in her new moonboot and we wish her a speedy recovery.

The term is flying by, and we are in week 7 already. Only 2 more weeks until camp. Teachers and students are getting very excited. Although we would love everyone to attend camp we understand that there are many reasons why your child may not be attending. If your child isn't going to camp, they are expected to attend school as usual. Due to current student numbers attending camp it is looking like two of our class teachers will remain at school and a relief teacher if required. All of our year 3-7 students have now been issued their own Chromebook to use at school. Teachers are working hard to get as much of the students learning online using Google Classroom. This will ensure all students at Paradise are confident IT users and well prepared when they move on to High School. We will also be lessening our footprint by cutting down our paper and photocopier usage.

We currently have a number of extra visitors on site. We have 8 pre service teachers Mario and Georgina in Miss Emily's class, Janelle and Chelsea in Miss Jaimee's class, Hayden and Kayla in Mr Alex's class, April in Mrs Retallick's class and Emma in The Quokkas. We also have 2 pre service Social Workers Bolaji and Terra. Welcome to our beautiful school- we hope you enjoy your placement. As well as these visitors we have regular weekly visitors working 1:1 with individual students. These are Non-Education Department Providers, Occupational Therapist, Speech Therapists. Behaviour Therapists and music tutors. The number of these visitors has increased by 80% since 2019. To enable us to monitor and manage this, all providers are now required to schedule their time on a timetable for the hall. This may mean that some previous arranged times

to work with your child are no longer suitable. To enable us to keep offering a space for these providers we appreciate your support in these necessary rearrangements.

A big congratulations to Miss Jaimee for writing a successful application for the Woolworths Landcare Grant. The school will receive \$1,500 to use in improving our vegetable garden. We will also use some of the funds to encourage more native bees into out garden.

North Eastern Districts School Soccer has started again here on Saturday's 8:00am till 1:00pm. I have been informed that if anyone is interested in playing soccer, they can pop in on Saturday morning and inquire with one of the organisers.

Other great events over the last 3 weeks have been Walk To School Day which saw approximately 20 families join staff and walk from The Paradise Hotel carpark. The school's Red Day raised just over \$200 to donate to the Salvation Army Red Shield Appeal. Everyone looked great in their red and the red donuts were delicious. Last week, all students participated in a number of different activities for Reconciliation Week. Everyone took part in creating a large canvas which will displayed in our school soon.

I would like to thank our Governing Council and our Fundraising Committee who work hard behind the scenes to support our little school. Without their dedication and commitment, we would not be able to offer special things like the Mother's Day Stall, Chocolate Fundraiser and the Family Fun Afternoon. There are so many more exciting things planned for the year, please continue to show your great support.

Long weekend coming up for the Queen's Birthday which will be followed by a pupil free day, 15th June. Staff will be training with a number of schools across Adelaide in Michael Fullan's Deep Learning. We look forward to sharing our new learning in this area at our Showcase Evening in Term 3. 
B5 PEN PALS
